

Fundations: We will finish our work in Unit 2 of Fundations. Students should be able to read and write short vowel words by tapping the sounds. Students will also review trick words. Most trick words have a heart part, a part or sound that doesn't follow the typical spelling rules. Our trick words are: **a**, **the**, **and**, **is**, **his**, and **of**. Please practice these words if your child does not recognize them quickly. Completed Unit 2 packets can be returned at the end of the week. We will take our test at the beginning of next week.

Reading: We will continue to work on the goal of reading more and more. We will set a goal and try to read that number of books. We may have to adjust our goal if it is too much or not enough. Goal setting is good way to be engaged and to increase our stamina! This week our reading questions will focus on the events of a story. What happened in the beginning? The middle? The end? Readers should think about the major events of the story.

We will continue to reinforce what we have learned about characters and settings. We can consider how the character(s) change from the beginning to the end. Do his/her feelings change? Does he/she learn something or grow in some way?

Writing: Our writers are learning to write in complete sentences. This includes starting each sentence with a capital letter, using space between our words and ending with a punctuation mark. Not all sentences end with a period. We will practice deciding which sentences end with a period and which end with question mark. We reread our sentence to make sure the words make sense. **Math:** This week, we will wrap up and review Topic 1. Students should understand that in some situations we have to put groups together (addition) and in others we have to compare or take apart (subtraction).

A review packet will be sent home on Monday. While not required, it is recommended that you work on one or two pages each night to practice before our test. First, look in the box for an example and explanation. Then, try it! You can always make up similar problems for your child to try on separate paper or a dry erase board. Packets may be returned for green dojos! The test is planned for Thursday.

Social Studies: This week our PRIDE letter is I. Students who show Whitney pride are Inclusive. We will learn that this means we include and accept everyone despite any differences and we are kind, caring friends. Being inclusive is all about kindness. While it's normal to have some friends that are closer than others, we need to practice treating everyone with respect. Use nice tones and try solving your problems with words. Try connecting with someone new and reach out to someone who may need a friend!
