

Fundations: We will complete Unit 1 of Fundations by reviewing our letters and sounds. Continue to work on the Unit 1 Home Support Pack to reinforce correct letter formation and for sound practice. We will have a test later this week. Finished packets can be returned in Home folders so that hard work can be recognized!

**Reading:** As we work to grow our independent reading stamina, we will learn how good reading habits help us to increase our time and our enjoyment of books!. It is a good habit to take a "sneak peek" of the book before reading so we have an idea of what it will be about. As we preview the first few pages, what questions pop in your head? Questions often start with Who? What? Where? When? Why? How? As we read, we "check" our sneak peek, try to answer our questions and even come up with new questions! Is that what we thought would happen? Is the story different than we expected?

Writing: We will continue to build our stamina with different types of writing for Work on Writing independence. Does your child complain about not having anything to do? Have him/her write a list, make a card, write a letter or just draw a picture and write some words to go with it! When we don't know how to spell a word, we can stretch it out slowly and write the sounds we hear!

Math: This week we will explore/review concepts of subtraction. While addition was putting parts together, subtraction can be seen as taking a part away from a group or a whole. We know we are subtracting when the minus sign is used in our equation. Subtraction can also be used to compare groups of objects. If I have 5 blue cubes and my friend has 2 red cubes, I can compare our cubes by subtracting. 5-2=3, so I have 3 more cubes. Students will continue to tear out and bring home each lesson as it is finished. Pages can be reviewed, but do not need to be returned.

Social Studies: We will continue to learn what it means to be respectful (the R in PRIDE). We can show respect by using good manners, following rules and being mindful of the personal space of others. We will learn to solve problems in a respectful manner. When there is a small problem with another child, we can solve the problem on our own. We say the problem, think of solutions, decide on the best one and follow our plan. If we cannot agree, it is time to find an adult. You can help by noticing and commenting on respectful behaviors and good manners at home!
